

Full Professor (or equivalent) Inaugural Eleanor Shea Professor of Art History

The McIntire Department of Art in the College of Arts and Sciences at the University of Virginia invites scholars of international stature, at the rank of full professor or the equivalent, to apply for the inaugural Eleanor Shea Professor of Art History.

We seek applicants who hold a PhD in art history or a related field, have a strong record of publication, and are pursuing innovative research in any subfield. Additionally, candidates should demonstrate prior excellence in teaching and mentorship of students, and a willingness to contribute to the scholarly life of the Department of Art and the PhD program. The successful candidate will join a community comprising twenty-nine faculty in Art History and Studio Art, and a PhD program in Art and Architectural History.

We request that the cover letter include a discussion of scholarship, possible research collaborations, and teaching and advising experience at the undergraduate and/or graduate level. It should address how the applicant has contributed to a departmental and university culture of diversity and inclusion, and note the potential for collaborative engagement in a department that includes studio art as well as art history.
